BEYOND LEAVE

EMBRACING THE FIELD

2023 launched the start of GRS Beyond Leave. An initiative that grants staff time away from the desk to volunteer on the ground with an organisation of their choice that is having an impact on people or the planet.

Beyond Leave took one of our team on a field trip with the world's largest anti-trafficking organisation, International Justice Mission (IJM). Their efforts involve strengthening judicial systems, the rescue and restoration of victims, bringing criminals to justice and scale demand for protection.

This leave was an opportunity to visit the cities being impacted by the work of IJM, encourage the team on the ground, meet some remarkable survivors and become forever impacted to advocate for the stories of transformation.

I requested beyond leave to better understand, and encourage the efforts of those fighting the war on OSEC, the online sexual exploitation of children. A crime which devastatingly reports Australia as the third global offender. The stories of abuse are near too much to bear.

IJM did two rescues of multiple children in the 5 days we were on the ground in Cebu, Philippines.

Meeting rescued children, survivor leaders, law enforcement, prosecution and restoration teams and hearing the stories of freedom is enough to bring you to tears. Truly an exhaustive work where the seemingly insurmountable is being overcome.

A WINTER WE'VE NOT SEEN

This winter launched the GRS Beyond Winter Initiative. Having given financially to this great work for years we felt it was time to put our hands to it.

Together with Vinnies Canberra, we spent an afternoon packing essential food and personal hygiene item parcels for distribution via emergency relief, Night Patrol, Street to Home and Family Services.

Receiving over 100 calls a day, calls from the Tumut area have increased by 575%, Harden by 271% and major increases all across Canberra. Saddening to hear the state of need in our immediate and broader community; ACT, far South Coast and Western NSW.

There is a growing statistic of first-time callers; two-income mortgage households. They are embarrassed to be reaching out, but they have never been under so much pressure to put food on the table for their family, put petrol in the car for school drop off or to afford necessary medications.

While we were packing a mother of four called. She was homeless in her car with her children and called simply for water as they were thirsty. Her need was met that afternoon.

Through needed donations and an amazing arm of over 550 volunteers across the region, Vinnies are able to distribute much needed assistance. If you can give financially, go ahead and contribute today.



making play a priority

How often do you play, or have you forgotten how? Have you trained your body and mind to accept a chemical or electronic substitution? You may find it easy to answer these questions. Alternatively, the topic may perplex, frustrate, or confuse you.

We value the importance of play. Real play. Play is that innate human ability to derive joy from physical interaction with our planet and others. Play involves an effort-for-reward equation, where pain is often encountered, but never the objective. Play unlocks something in our brains and bodies that few other activities can rival. It transports you to an alternative reality where competition and toil for station are no longer drivers. Instead, something else takes over, joy.

Joy is the unrivalled human ability to take pleasure in the moment despite circumstances to the contrary.

This joy is best shared with others. The adventure, the experience, the feeling of stoke, is amplified when friends are present. Relationships grow deeper when play is at the centre.

Play is not without challenges, generally they are in partnership. The challenge of navigating obstacles enhances the transaction, and the reward requires little investment other than time. And there lies the problem. A small sacrifice of time can seem impossible in a digital world that seeks to occupy every second of your waking hours. For me, I set time in the schedule to play. I ride mountain bikes on Wednesday evenings, I play music on Thursdays and Sundays, and I try to surf, skate or bike every Saturday.
